Ohio law mandates that school systems have on file a statement signed by BOTH the physician and the parent or guardian for ALL medications – both prescription and non-prescription, over-the-counter pharmacy medications – that are administered to a student.

A supply of typical generic and name brand non-prescription, over-the-counter medications as listed below are available at the school for students. Please mark either “yes” or “no” for each medication listed to either grant or deny authority for the school to dispense these typical over-the-counter medications and treatment as deemed necessary for minor illnesses and injuries at the discretion of the School Nurses and/or school personnel.

		Tylenol (Acetaminophen) – used to relieve pain and reduce fever and discomfort
		Advil, Aleve, Motrin , etc. (Ibuprofen) – an anti-inflammatory drug used to relieve inflammation, swelling, stiffness, joint pain and possible fever
		Sudafed (Pseudoephedrine HCL) or Advil Cold & Sinus – used to relieve nasal or sinus congestion caused by the common cold, sinusitis, and hay fever and other respiratory allergies
		Liquid Cough Medicine - relieves or suppresses cough
		Mucinex – a decongestant used to help loosen mucous and clear congestion
		Benedryl – an antihistamine used to relieve or prevent the itching, sneezing, runny nose, and watery eye symptoms usually associated with the common cold
		Claritin – used for seasonal allergy relief
		Antacid Tablets – taken by mouth to relieve heartburn, sour stomach, or acid indigestion by neutralizing excess stomach acid
		Milk of Magnesia – Laxative and antacid
		Medicine for lactose intolerance - relieves discomfort associated with dairy products
		Insect Sting Swab – relieves discomfort if stung by an insect
		Visine or generic eyewash – used to relieve irritation in the eye
		External Analgesic Creams – used to help relieve redness, swelling, itching, and discomfort of many skin problems
		Topical Antibiotic Creams – used to reduce discomfort and possible infection from many skin problems
		Burn Gel – Relieve discomfort due to contact burns without blisters and intact skin
		Bendaryl Spray – Antihistamine spray used to relieve itching, redness due to insect stings.
		Throat Spray – Relieve discomfort due to sore throat.
		Zyrtec or Claritin – for seasonal allergies

I understand that all medication – both prescription and non-prescription, over-the-counter medications – will be held by the Health Department or, in the dormitories, by the Residential Staff, and will be dispensed according to direction by a member of the Andrews Osborne Academy staff. I also understand that students are not permitted to have any medications – prescription or non-prescription – in their possession with the exception of epipens, inhalers, or birth control pills.

I further understand that if I prefer that a specific non-prescription, over-the-counter medication not listed above be dispensed to my child for a particular condition, I can provide this over-the-counter medication in the original container and complete the information listed on **the form entitled: Prescription and Non-Prescription Medication.**

Authority is hereby granted for the dispensing of the medications listed above and treatment as deemed necessary for minor illnesses and injuries by the school nurse and Andrews Osborne Academy staff.
